INSTRUMENTAL & CHORAL CLASSES

STRINGS & STRING MUSICIANSHIP – Period 1 or 2

(Must have completed Grade 3). For students interested in beginning the violin, viola, cello, and string bass.

BRASS & BRASS MUSICIANSHIP – Period 1

(Must have completed Grade 3). For beginning students interested in trumpet, french horn, trombone, baritone, and tuba.

WOODWINDS & WOODWIND MUSICIANSHIP - Period 1

(Must have completed Grade 3). For students interested in beginning flute, oboe, clarinet, saxophone, and bassoon.

PERCUSSION & PERCUSSION MUSICIANSHIP - Period 2

(Must have completed Grade 3). For students interested in beginning rudiments of drumming. Students must provide a kit (sticks, snare drum & drum pad).

CHORAL WORKSHOP – Period 1

(Must have completed Grade 3). For students who love to sing, this class will provide the opportunity to develop better vocal control.

JAZZ AND ROCK IMPROVISATION AND MUSIC THEORY – Period 2

(Must have completed Grade 7). For students who would like to learn how to improvise through the incorporation of music theory skills. This course with Advanced Guitar, Advanced Band, or Advanced Orchestra make an excellent combination.

BEGINNING GUITAR – Period 2, 3 or 4

(Must have completed Grade 5). An introduction to the fundamentals of guitar playing. Students must provide their own guitar.

ADVANCED GUITAR – Period 2, 3 or 4

(Must have completed Grade 5). For the student who already has experience with note reading and chord position playing. Students must provide their own guitar.

BAND – equal to two classes

(Must have completed Grade 4 or above)

INTERMEDIATE BAND – Period 3 & 4 (2 classes)

Open to students who have completed one year of study on a band instrument.

ADVANCED BAND/STAGE BAND – Period 3 & 4 (2 classes)

For moderate and advanced players of band instruments. This group will perform medium and/or advanced band literature, as well as stage band literature.

ORCHESTRA – equal to two classes

(Must have completed Grade 4 or above)

INTERMEDIATE ORCHESTRA - Period 3 & 4 (2 classes)

Open to students who have one year of a string instrument. Introduction to orchestral literature and group performance.

ADVANCED ORCHESTRA – Period 3 & 4 (2 classes)

For moderate and advanced players of string and other advanced orchestral instruments. Study of advanced orchestral literature and advanced performance techniques.

Please note: All above scheduled classes are tentative and are subject to change depending on enrollment and teacher availability. **Courses will not run if enrollment does not meet the minimum class size requirements.**
